Disproportionality Index: Pennsylvania Partnerships for Children's analysis of 2022 American Community Survey (5-year estimates), Tables C27001(A-G, I). The index is calculated by comparing the uninsured child count to the total child population of the same race and ethnicity category.

- An index of less than 1.0 indicates underrepresentation of that race category in the uninsured population.
- An index of 1.0 indicates no disproportionality.
- An index of 1.1 and greater indicates overrepresentation of that race category in the uninsured population. For example, an index of 3.0 means the race group is represented in the uninsured population three times its rate in the general child population.

The 2023 American Community Survey (1-year estimate) was used for the Pennsylvania fact sheet.
